Hello Devon! Another year is in the books and with it, we are just over halfway through our four-year term with Council.

This past November, we approved Devon's 2024-28 Capital Budget and 2024-26 Operating Budget as we entered year two of our Three-Year Fiscal Recovery and Service Stabilization Plan. These past two budgets have been far from easy as we have been tasked with doing our part to maintain services throughout Devon while mitigating increasing costs and funding the Town's reserves for the future.

Earlier this summer, we hosted the inaugural Make-a-Wish Slo Pitch
Tournament at our new Paragon Ballpark to wrap up our first full season at the ballpark.
We were very proud to support this event and showcase both our diamonds and community to the hundreds that made their way out to Devon to be a part of making kids' wishes come true.

October was a huge month for us as we celebrated the official opening of the long-awaited Michigan Street extension that connects to the new intersection on Highway 19. This is absolutely huge for Devon as it opens up access to our south

border, making it more attractive to developers and investment in our community.

We have been working hard with Administration to continue to progress our Strategic Priorities and we were pleased to hear another update this past November. Our Strategic Priorities, along with all updates, are available on the Town's website at **devon.ca/strategic-priorities** shortly after they are shared with Council and I encourage everyone to have a read and share your feedback with us anytime.



Devon Council approved the 2024-2026 Operating & 2024-2028 Capital Budgets at their Nov. 27 Council Meeting with a 5.25 per cent municipal tax increase for 2024.

For a household with an assessed value of \$322,000, the estimated impact of a 5.25 per cent tax increase is about \$111 per year or \$9.25 per month.

Property assessments are based on the market value of a property as of July 1 of the previous year and as such, these are estimated impacts.

The final municipal tax rate will be approved in May 2024 and tax notices will be mailed out to Devon property owners on May 31 with payment due June 30, 2024.



Three-Year Fiscal Recovery & Service Stabilization Plan

Last year, the Town developed a plan to mitigate a large municipal tax increase due to costs outside of the Town's control. In December 2022, Council approved the Three-Year Fiscal Recovery & Service Stabilization Plan to mitigate this increase through select service reductions and the use of the Income Stabilization Reserve (ISR), while ensuring that this reserve is replenished by 2026.

2024 Budget Notable Items

Cost Increases Impacting 2024 Property Taxes

- RCMP contract increases. These costs are federally regulated and out of the Town's control.
- Rise in operating costs due to inflationary pressures (fuel, equipment, utilities, insurance, etc.)

Reserve Funding - Income Stabilization Reserve & Capital Reserves

- The Town will continue repaying the ISR, contributing \$125,000 back into the reserve in 2024. This important reserve was utilized for the 2023 & 2024 budget to mitigate municipal tax increases for the years.
- Other critical Capital Reserves will also receive large contributions in the amount of \$330,220 to fund future projects.

Select Service Levels Restored - Crack Sealing & Storm Sewer Repair

• In 2023, the Town chose to reduce crack sealing to main roads and trails saving \$42,000 and reduce the Storm Sewer repair budget by \$25,000 to help balance a challenging budget. These critical pieces of maintenance are restored in the 2024 budget.

2024 Utility Budget

The 2024 Utility Budget includes increases to the Town's water, wastewater, bulk water, natural gas, and solid waste & recycling starting Jan. 1, 2024, to ensure Devon's utilities remain self-supporting.

The estimated utility increase for a Devon household that uses 240m/3 of water and 130 GJ of natural gas per year in 2024 is approximately \$14.41/month or \$172.92/year.

2024 Utility Rates:

Water Rate (increase of 9.7%)

- Basic Monthly Charge: 16.43 per month
- Commodity Charge: \$1.90/m3

Wastewater Rate (increase of 6.8%)

- Basic Monthly Charge: \$38.57 per month
- Commodity Charge: \$2.53/m3

Natural Gas Rate (increase of 7.2%)

- Basic Monthly Charge: \$35 per month
- Commodity Charge: \$1.93/GJ

Solid Waste & Recycling Rate (increase of 5.2%)

 Monthly Charge for Weekly Pickup: \$32.60 per month

Bulk Water Rate (increase of \$0.25/m3)

• \$5.50 per cubic metre

Storm Water Drainage (no change)

• \$8 per month

Capital budget highlights

Some of the major projects slated for 2024 in the Capital Budget include:

- Repurposing the Esso Building (Federal Grant Dependent)
- Solar pathway & signalized crosswalk lighting
- Underground sanitary and water infrastructure evaluation
- Zamboni replacement (cost share with Parkland County)
- Splash Park feature replacement Tower Spinner
- Walking trail rehabilitation
- Roadway reconstruction Continued on Erie Street



Devonian Trail now open



Devonian Trail & Hwy 19 Interchange is open!

Devon's new **Devonian Trail** that connects from the new south Michigan Street connection to Highway 19 is open and ready to welcome everyone here to Devon!

This long-awaited infrastructure upgrade is significant for Devon as the southern border now connects directly to the newly twinned section of Highway 19 providing shorter commute times for residents and a whole new avenue of access into the community.

Thank you to the Government of Alberta for their support with this project and for turning over the old section of Highway 19 (now Devonian Trail) to the Town.

We look forward to seeing the middle section of Highway 19 twinned in the near future to provide a safer commute for everyone that uses this busy road.
